




In the game of clock patience (or clock solitaire as it can be known), you begin by dealing the 52 cards of a standard deck face down into <u>thirteen piles of four cards</u> <u>each</u>, arranged as follows:

Set up the Clock Face

- The face down piles correspond to the numbers on a clock: Ace, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, Jack, Queen around the clock.
- The inside pile corresponds to the King.

Start the game

 Take the top card from the King pile. If it's a number (e.g., 3), slip it under the pile <u>face up</u> at that position (3 o'clock). If it's a King, place it <u>face up</u> under the King pile.



Play around the clock

- Take the top card from the pile where you just placed a card and slip it under its corresponding pile.
- Repeat this process until the fourth King is revealed. Slip it under the three other Kings.

Win or lose? It takes Patience!

• If all cards are face-up, you win. If not, you lose.

The approved way to cheat ...

• If you encounter a face-down card, starting from the Ace pile, flip it over and place it under its corresponding pile. Repeat this until you win.
